### LOTS OF WORSHIP AT CHRISTMAS

For those of you who notice such things, it's Advent now. That's a time originally intended for fasting and spiritual preparation for Christmas. It has of course been eclipsed in the last few generations by an entirely different kind of preparation for Christmas. Thus two days before the beginning of Advent, we celebrated the new national holy days of Black Friday, followed by Local Saturday, Cyber Monday, and Giving Tuesday (clearly an afterthought!). Tom Lehrer warned us of this in the fifties: "Angels we have heard on high tell us to go out and buy." So it's old news.

This year we're going to fight back, not with more stickers, cards and Facebook posts about how Jesus is the Reason for the Season. Instead, we're going to have an extra helping of Christmas worship. Join us for all the worship, and reclaim a worshipful Christmas for yourself and your family!

To begin with, the Sunday before Christmas, December 18, at 5:30 p.m., we'll have a "Blue Christmas" service, especially for those of you who have suffered loss and loneliness, and for whom Christmas can be a time of renewed grief. We haven't done this before, but in a year when we have lost so many beloved members of the congregation, we need it.

Christmas Eve (Saturday, December 24) we'll have our main worship at 5:30 p.m. in Wesley Chapel. We're going to pack the place with great singing and a short message, followed by lighting candles and singing Silent Night. We're going to squeeze into Wesley Chapel because it's such a great space for singing!

Then at 11:00 p.m. we're going to try something else we haven't done in a very long

time: a quiet and prayerful service as we celebrate the arrival of the day we have awaited so long. And the message will be different from the previous service!

This year, Christmas Day falls on Sunday, so we will also have our usual Sunday morning worship, focused of course on the joy of the day. If you have family around at Christmas, make this part of your plan for the day. It's OK to show up in your pajamas and robe, definitely as you are, and ready to sing. If you don't have family that day, then you need to be together with us for a time of community togetherness, like the shepherds and wise men gathered around a manger long ago.
