A Conflict of Loyalties

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church is over for another four years. It left unresolved the question of what to do about sexuality in the denomination, and has decided to move forward only with the appointment of a committee to look at solutions for going forward. Not as though we haven't had those before, and not as though we'll agree at the end of another two years of conversation. All this makes plenty of us United Methodist clergy ask whether we still belong in the denomination. The same question is being asked by a great variety of people with a great variety of opinions about where we should go from here.

The indecision of General Conference has given me cause to ask why I hesitate and remain in the denomination. Certainly there are big things like income, employment, pension, and knowing people around the denomination. I've put my last twentyone years as a pastor into the strengthening of United Methodist ministries. Are these earthly concerns too small to worry about? There's more. There's the covenant I entered, to receive the appointments I was given, to be under orders rather than to work for my own interest. Within the denomination, I can continue to be one of the people who continue to stand up and speak for full inclusion of people of gender and sexual minorities. I have a loyalty to work within this denomination, my community. What's more, sexuality is not the greatest problem faced by United Methodists, who are subject to tribal violence in Africa, and religious persecution in some Asian countries. Surely there's a call to remain committed to those brothers and sisters in faith, whose need is profound.

On the other side of the question is my loyalty to the many good and faithful people I know, who are excluded from ordination, and even from public church marriage, by the position of my denomination. Does my remaining a United

Methodist betray them? Am I insulting or lessening them if I continue to represent the United Methodist Church? Should I become UCC, or even Unitarian? Should I give up church ministry entirely, out of solidarity with others? I appreciate that none of my sexual minority friends has yet suggested that I should.

The thing that always frustrates me most suddenly and deeply is a conflict of expectations and loyalties. How can my first loyalty be to God? How can I give a full commitment to love of all people, and remain committed to the Church that does not? I suspect that I shall remain in the United Methodist Church, and that I shall also become a stronger advocate for equality.
