# A Bit of Background

Last month, I introduced myself by telling you a little about my call to ministry because that's where it all has to begin ... with the call.

But I also know that you likely have a few, more basic questions. Who is this person? What is she like? Will I connect with her as my pastor? Soon enough, I will be working and worshipping with you so you will be able to answer these questions for yourself. In the meantime, let me share the basics.

I was born and raised in Valparaiso, IN, coming to Michigan to attend Albion College. After graduating in 1994, I rented an apartment in town (on Cass) for a year before heading off to Mississippi to work on a political campaign. For the next five years, I was based in Mississippi but traveled the country doing political work.

In 2000, I returned to Michigan for good and soon went to work for state government. I held a variety of jobs during my 15 years in state government, including Staff Director for the Senate Democratic Caucus, Communications Director for the State Budget Office, Special Projects Manager for the Governor, Chief of Staff for the Lieutenant Governor and finally Deputy Director at the Department of Civil Rights.

In 2015, I knew it was time to follow God's call. University United Methodist Church in East Lansing offered me a true gift - the chance to work in ministry while I began my education. It's been a remarkable 18 months at UUMC. In that time, I've become a licensed local pastor, completed my first year of seminary and learned the business of ministry. Thanks to their love and encouragement, I am ready to embark on our journey together.

Shortly after returning to Michigan, I also became a foster parent and eventually adopted
