March in Worship

March 1 is Ash Wednesday. We'll have worship that day at noon in Wesley Chapel, just half an hour or so. It's a time to begin the holy walk of Lent--the Christian time of fasting that's a little like Ramadan.

Worship Series: Voices of God

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of **Lent**, the six weeks of spiritual preparation leading up to Easter. For the six Sundays during Lent, Jeremy will be speaking on six biblical characters who acted as voices for God: Moses, Samuel, Elijah, Ezekiel, Jeremiah, and John the Baptist.



March 5: Moses, the original prophet who spoke for God to Pharaoh, to his own people, who

brought the name of God to the people in Egypt, and led them through the desert to the Jordan river.

March 12: Samuel, who was the last prophet to rule the tribes, who anointed the first two kings of Israel, Saul and David.



March 19: Ezekiel, who had visions when his people were captives in Babylon, and changed the whole way his people thought about God.

March 26: Elijah, who felt entirely isolated as one of the last faithful worshipers of God, in a time when the kings had turned against God. He despaired more than once, yet kept being "zealous for the Lord."





April 2: Jeremiah, who loved the people, and suffered while he tried to warn of the total military defeat that was coming. He blamed the defeat on God's judgment against the people. In the midst of that defeat, he also

shouted to everyone who would listen, that the coming destruction would not be permanent, but that they could hope in a better future. Is that a message you're ready to hear today?

April 9: John the Baptist, who identified Jesus as the one we were waiting for. He was a harsh critic of the Temple leadership before he learned about Jesus, and never failed to speak truth to power, even when it cost him his life.

2017 World Day of Prayer

Saturday, March 4, 1 p.m. St. James Episcopal Church Am I Being Unfair to You?

Program based on Matthew 20:1-16 written by the World Day of Prayer Committee of the Philippines

Mabuhay! Come to the circle and tell your story!

In the story Jesus told about the kingdom of heaven, he saw no wrongdoing in giving equally. However, the workers who felt entitled to receive more greatly complained. This dialogue is turned into a question for the 2017 WDP theme - "Am I Being Unfair to You?"

As we prepare for worship, women and girls from the Philippines enter carrying symbols with a story. Merlyn, Celia, and Editha represent the lives of many Filipino women and girls who are victims of domestic violence or sex trafficking, migrant domestic workers in the country or abroad, and survivors harmed emotionally and economically by disasters in the environment or unsustainable development policies.

How can we hear these stories and not realize the sinfulness of structures that consolidate economic inequality? We are called to confess and take on our ethical responsibility to answer God's call for justice.

A traditional cultural practice, known as dagyaw, is introduced in the program. Dagyaw is a communal way of laboring each other's farms and equally benefiting from the harvest. It is used more frequently among organic farmers for sustainable agriculture.

"It is a good practice for building and sustaining a community, an actualization of compassion and care for each other." Maybe this is the key to a collective answer to "Am I Being Unfair to you?" **March 2017**
