

# **Budget & Finance Update**

The start of a new year means it is, once again, budget time at the church.

Thanks to the hard work of Sally Ammerman and Rick Lange, we've closed the 2017 books and we ended the year with a lot to celebrate. You supported the work of the church by giving above and beyond your commitments. Our pledged and non-pledged giving was higher than expected. In addition, our expenses were less than originally budgeted. As a result, we ended the year well in the black.

Even more exciting ... as of January 2018, we are, once again, debt-free! With the proceeds from our Endowment, we were able to pay off the remaining balances on the mortgage and line-of-credit which had been used to cover major expenses including the roof, fire alarm system, windows and heating and air conditioning repairs.

Though we begin the year in a strong financial position, our pledges for 2018 are down from last year. This is not entirely unexpected as

long-time members leave the church through death or departure. As a result, the 2018 budget will be less than the year just completed.

The final details of the budget are still being developed by the Finance Committee. In February, they will make a budget recommendation to the Church Council for approval. If you are interested in this process, keep your eye on the calendar for these meetings. They are open to anyone interested in attending.
