When I recently returned from UMW Assembly 2018, "The Power of Bold", I pondered how my attendance at these quadrennial gatherings has influenced the UM Woman I am today. In 1970, our family was preparing to move to Albion from Ann Arbor. The Women's Society of Christian Service of Ann Arbor First UMC insisted on sending Vice President Luree Wright and me to Assembly, even though I could not finish my term as President. On the plane to Houston, TX, we met Barb Stowell and Joan Kile from Albion FUMC! (I already knew Barb

from my college days at Albion.) I was awed by the power of the speakers, music, and encounters with Methodist women across the nation. I even had a one-on-one session with Malvina Reynolds, composer of "Magic Penny", "Little Boxes", "Turn Around", and many more beloved songs. For the next 28 years my life as a wife, mother, and teacher kept me from quadrennial assemblies until I retired and attended the "Make Plain the Vision" 1998 UMW Assembly in Orlando, FL, with Dottie Kammer. I have been to every one since that time; 2002 Philadelphia, 2006 Anaheim, CA, 2010 St. Louis and 2014 Louisville with my daughter, Ellen, and 2018 Columbus. I must have known half of the women on the West Michigan bus this year, but I made three new friends; my roommate, another Donna, and a retired missionary to Haiti.

I was awed and inspired by the speakers: Nobel Peace Prize winner, Leymah Gbowee; Michelle Alexander and Marian Wright Edelman (one of Mary Margaret Moore's "sheroes"). The Bible study focused on Mary, mother of Jesus, as a woman who knew the power of bold. On stage and in charge was Shannon Priddy, National UMW President, daughter of Dottie Priddy, Albion's UMW president, 1979-80. Through prayer, scripture, dance, drama, and song our spirits and minds were stretched and inspired.

The interactive exhibits were challenging. Just try balancing your needs with a minimum wage on a real scale. Listen to a costumed woman tell her life story as a missionary in the Congo before the 20th century. All United Methodist Women are not little old ladies. There were babies, tweens, teens, college women, mature women, old women; females wearing sandals, athletic shoes, orthopedic shoes, high heels, in wheel chairs; wearing jeans, shorts, skirts, sweatshirts, tee shirts, dresses, tattoos, no jewelry, lots of jewelry. I heard many languages: English, Spanish, Korean, Haitian. Of the over 7,000 in attendance, I believe every state in the USA was represented. We are alike and different. We are challenged, concerned, and committed. I am one of many. I am still learning the Power of Bold. I plan to go to Assembly 2022 in Orlando, FL. (My daughter says she'll push my wheel chair!) You can come, too.

Budget Update

Transparency is critical in every organization, including churches, so beginning this month, The Spire will include periodic budget updates. The Treasurer and Finance Committee produce quarterly reports, the highlights of which will be shared here. (Please note, the information below refers only to the operating budget which does not include the Trustees Committee's separate budget. Updates on Trustees spending will also be included from time to time.)

For the first quarter of 2018, giving was slightly below expected levels. This is not uncommon but can become a problem if it continues through multiple quarters. So, if you've made a pledge, please check to see if it's current.

First quarter spending, on the other hand, was below projections. Lower than expected costs at the parsonage and around the church helped off-set the lower-than-expected giving, leaving us just \$2,400 behind at the end of the quarter.

There are no secrets in church finances. If you have any questions about this information or anything else related to the budget, just ask Pastor Leslee or Rick Lange, the Finance Committee Chairperson.

Albion FUMC was recently recognized for our long partnership with the American Red Cross. Thanks to all those who work so hard to make this possible and all those who donate to save lives.

Non-Cash Gift Policy

The Board of Trustees has adopted a new policy regarding the donation of noncash items. In short, the Trustees have determined that the church cannot accept unsolicited, non-cash gifts of any kind that are intended for use by or within the church. Persons wishing to donate items must contact the Board of Trustees in advance for an evaluation of the items to be considered before delivering any items to the church.

The Board of Trustees will evaluate the items and make a determination as to whether the items will be accepted or not at its next regularly scheduled board meeting.

This policy applies to any and all non-cash items such as, but not limited to, furniture, tools, photos, pictures, clothing, rugs, carpeting, decorative bric-a-brac, appliances, and medical equipment.

The full policy statement adopted by the Board of Trustees is available for review by any church member upon request by asking Cindi Klingel in the church office, Pastor Leslee, or any Trustee.
