Buy A Child A Book

The single greatest predictor of educational success is early exposure to reading and yet too many of our children don't have the access they need.

This summer, as a part of our Michigan Area Annual Conference, we will have the opportunity to help provide books to children across Michigan. Julie Bard, the wife of Bishop David Bard and a teacher, has teamed up with the Michigan Conference of Deacons, the Scholastic Literacy Partnerships and Cokesbury to give churches the chance to purchase reduced-price books for distribution.

Do you have \$3.96 to help a child? That's all it takes. \$3.96 will buy *The Wheels on the Bus* or *Pierre the Penguin, A True Story* or many other books for children from infancy through the 5th grade.

Here's how it works ... between now and late May, we collect money. We pick out the books we want, fill out the order form and I take it all with me when I head to Traverse City for Annual Conference.

A collection box for donations will be available on Sundays in Wesley and every day in the church office between now and Sunday, May 20th.

In 1902, a group of women associated with the United Methodist Church in Grand Rapids saw a need to provide assistance to families in the area. This was the start of the United Methodist Community House (UMCH). It has grown over the years to provide assistance to children, teenagers, and senior citizens. Our local unit has helped to support the UMCH and its activities through our contributions from Ingathering, our pledge to missions through the Albion District UMW, and through our collection of pop can tabs. By

collecting thousands of tabs throughout the district, United Methodist Women helped pay for a new roof for UMCH.

In a recent letter written in the STAR (the Albion District newsletter), the executive director of UMCH wrote to thank the United Methodist Women for their support over the years. He said, "The deeding of the property to UMCH is a great blessing to us." They will continue to provide the services that were supported by the UMW for over 100 years, so that UMCH will continue to "thrive for another 100 years."

What the heck are Ministry Shares, anyway?

The United Methodist Church is a connectional denomination. That means we covenant to work together through a structure of conferences, districts and local churches to do what no one person, or one church, could do alone. Through this covenant, we multiply and share God's gifts with our local communities, our nation and our world.

The Ministry Shares we are asked to pay are our part of that covenant (our dues, if you will). The amount is determined by an average of our operating budget over the last few years. For 2018, Albion FUMC has been asked to contribute just over \$29,000.

These dollars support everything from the administrative costs of the denomination, to the seminaries and educational programs that train our leaders (yes, that includes me ©) to the mission, outreach and evangelism that the United Methodist Church engages in around the world.

Albion FUMC has a long track record of paying 100% of our Ministry Shares, but it's no secret that we have had a few tight budget years recently. In 2015, this line item was removed from the budget and we have attempted to meet this obligation in other ways. Our goal is to restore this important item to the budget as soon as possible. In the meantime, we will continue seeking creative solutions to ensure we pay all of our bills, including this one.

On Sunday, May 20th, we will take a special offering to make our first payment toward our Ministry Shares. Please consider prayerfully what you might be able to contribute to support the work of the church in this way.

What's Happening in Fellowship Lounge?

A new look in Fellowship Lounge is in the works! Recently new light fixtures and a new color on an accent wall have been put in place. Furniture has been ordered along with a couple of new tables and lamps. Creative thought and crafty handiwork has gone into wall art which will take its place in due time.

This project actually began about four years ago when a grant match from the Olson Foundation became an opportunity. At that time, the Trustees rightfully gave priority attention to window and roof replacements. The time has at last arrived when Trustees can participate by matching a gift dedicated for the singular purpose of re-furnishing Fellowship Lounge. And so, a plan has been approved and the work has already begun.

Fellowship Lounge is the most public area of our church. Many community groups, local families, Boy Scouts, student groups and sometimes even the college reserve this space for large events. A fresh updated style in this room sets a tone for what we'd like the public to know about our church — that we are a solid, vibrant organization offering a quality experience for all.

The new look is designed to be comfortable and welcoming and to support a variety of activities, both large group and small. It is an invitation to our guests (and our members) to sit and stay awhile with us. Watch the step-by-step process as pieces of the plan come together.
