How could we sing the Lord's song...in a foreign land? Psalm 137:4

I've been thinking about exile a lot lately. Not only exile, but Exile. The Babylonian Exile is the name given the removal of the upper strata of the Hebrew people and their relocation to Babylon. It involved the destruction of the temple. All of a sudden, the chosen people found themselves in a foreign land, made to serve foreign masters, having to figure out how to worship God when God's own house had been demolished.

We too have struggled to figure out how to sing the Lord's song in unusual circumstances. I'll be honest. I was very ready to further return to normal. To begin to add more into our service. To possibly move back to Wesley Chapel. But now with the Delta variant, it looks like we will again have to be flexible, to put our plans on hold.

This why I've been thinking about exile, and specifically how the people of God responded to exile. I think they responded in two ways:

- 1. Lament. They acknowledged that this situation is awful. No one knows how this is going to work out. It sucks, and its ok to say that it sucks.
- 2. Resilience. The people did not give up worship of God. But they also didn't worship in the exact same way. They figured out what was essential to their faith and found ways to be the chosen people even in a foreign land.

In this time of continued change, as we continue to struggle through this pandemic, let us continue the tradition of the people of God. Let us lament. Let us find the core of our faith


