Church Finances on Solid Ground as 2019 Ends

Though the final numbers are still being crunched, the financial indicators for the church look positive as the year draws to an end.

The 2019 budget was nearly 10% higher than the previous year's budget thanks to this church's strong commitment to restoring our pastor's position to full-time. The many people who upped their commitment or made first time commitments to make that increase possible saw those commitments through. For the third year in a row, giving will exceed expectations in 2019! Thank you for your faithful stewardship.

In addition, expenditures have been at or below expectations in most areas so we expect to end the year have spent a little less than planned. This strong position of increased giving and controlled expenditures also made it possible for us to pay 100% of our Ministry Shares to the conference and district for the first time since 2014!

The next six weeks are a busy time in the financial life of the church. The 2020 pledge campaign will wrap up and the annual budget will be recommended by Finance Committee and adopted by the Church Council. Stay tuned for updates on this process in the weekly bulletin and next month's *Spire*.

Study Hall for Albion College Students

Albion FUMC hosted a study hall in Tennant Hall for Albion College students before Fall semester finals, on Saturday and Sunday, December 7th and 8th. Nearly 60 students took advantage of the opportunity to study in a quiet and comfortable space, or to just stop in for a study break and grab something to eat (not all of the students have a meal plan). Thank you to everyone who helped provide abundant



coffee, mac and cheese, pulled pork, veggies, chips, salsa, hummus, and cookies, and/or helped with setup and cleanup. Quite a few of the students stopped in to the kitchen to say thank you. The Future of the United Methodist Church

There has been considerable news over the last few days regarding a new proposal to end the decades-long debate over inclusion in the United Methodist Church. While the details are still coming into focus, our leaders have begun the discussion of what it could mean to the future of the church.

Bishop Bard, responding to the news, said in part, "my initial impression is that this is an extraordinarily hopeful development. The protocol offers The United Methodist Church a unique opportunity to move beyond our current impasse over ministry with LGBTQ+ persons and toward a needed restructuring in our governance. It also acknowledges the on-going work needed in addressing long-standing issues of racial-ethnic inclusion within our denomination."
