Death and Resurrection

This month finds us on the cusp of Holy Week. Holy Week is on odd week. It starts with the triumphal entry of Palm Sunday, takes a quick nose dive to the sorrow and betrayal of Good Friday, and then ends with the mystery and joy of Easter. All within 7 days.

I usually find myself annoyed by this pace. There is so much rich theology in each of these events, that I wish we had a week for each one. The political implications of Jesus marching on to Jerusalem, Jesus' self-less acts and final discourse during the Last Supper, the human drama of the betrayals on Good Friday, the meaning of Easter and resurrection. All of it deserves more than one week can provide.

Yet, as we all have experienced these past two years, life often doesn't give us the time we'd like. Like the church year, we may go stretches of months without anything significant happening. Then all of a sudden, we are inundated. For instance, in the last 3 months, my son got Covid, we had to isolate at our home for a month, we had numerous snow days, then my dad had a heart attack on my birthday. It's all a lot.

So while I wish Lent was a longer, I think its shortness is actually useful. It mirrors our human experience of things seemingly going from great to terrible and back again all at once. It affirms that even when we walk with God, the fallen-ness of the world can still impact us. It reminds us that the joy of the present moment may not last. But it also equally reminds us that the sorrow and guilt of the present moment also won't last.

Summary of February 22, 2022 SPRC meeting Regular meeting of the committee.

Committee Chair: Andy French

Meeting opened at 7:05 with prayer by Pastor Joel

Minutes from January meeting and the agenda were approved

The committee was provided with a history of the building attendants arrangements by Carol Maynard.

There was a discussion of primary duties of the building attendants: building security and support for setting up and taking down for activities in the building are the primary duties.

Carol advised that the Trustees have appointed her as liaison for the building attendants. She will review conditions in their area. Church secretary has day-to-day operational oversight.

To assure the Building Attendants understand the responsibility of their position, a guidance document will be revised and will be used for orientation during their interviews for the positions.

Pastor Joel provided a Pastoral report.

The committee discussed and agreed to follow a monthly activity schedule to assure we complete our duties.

Annual staff reviews will be started.

The committee will continue to look at custodial and housekeeper duties to assure efficiencies.

Joel advised that the Ramen restaurant will start operations in March in the church kitchen.

Summary of March 2022 meeting

Meeting was held on March 22 at 6 P.M. There was a discussion about the new Building Attendant agreement developed by the Trustees. There was a discussion about the BA oversight person and her roles and responsibilities. Roles and responsibilities were discussed. Cindi K will still have day to day oversight responsibilities. The committee requested that we receive quarterly updates on progress or issues.

There was a discussion on the new process for staff annual reviews and committee members were assigned staff reviews to complete for this year. They were asked to complete the reviews by May.

Our operating fund collects pledged and nonpledge giving, and pays for staff, programming, and most ongoing building expenses, such as utilities and insurance.
