From a Certain Point of View

Sunday November 28 begins Advent. This is the season in the church year when we wait. We anticipate. We spend time reflecting on what the birth of Christ means for us.

This month in worship, we're going to take a look at some of the different characters in the Advent story, and view the story through their eyes. What would it have been like to be Mary, an unwed teenage mother? How might the birth of Jesus be seen through Joseph's eyes? What might the faithfulness of the shepherds or the witness creation say about Jesus' coming?

The novelist Chimamanda Ngozi Adiche, in a well-known TED Talk, discusses the importance of stories. In particular, Adichie comments on the danger of a single story. Only having a single story can warp our view of the world. It can make us blind to complexities. It can lead to bad assumptions about other people. For many of us, we've heard the Christmas story so many times, often mediated through popular culture, that we forget its complexity. We forget the radical message of Mary. We forget the self-less love of Joseph. We forget how Jesus's birth upended social and economic norms. And we forget how the birth of Jesus was a rupture, the reign of righteousness sidling its way into human history.

Wesley Renovation Update

How we got here:

Renovating Wesley Chapel and Lounge has been a part of our broader building upgrade plans for a couple of decades. As many know, we have also received two significant bequests that have been designated for use to renovate Wesley.

Why we're here:

Wesley Chapel and Lounge have not had any major updates since they were constructed in the mid-50's. In looking at our church's mission and vision, we decided the space needed to be more accessible, visible, hospitable, and usable. This includes improving the bathrooms, accessibility in Wesley Chapel, and the visibility and accessibility of the archway.

Where we are now:

We are in the process of negotiating with an architect. We've narrowed the scope of what we need to the architect for to the renovation of the bathroom/kitchenette areas. Some of the other parts of the project, such as expanding the chancel area, repaving the archway road, and enhancing the archway lighting, would not need an architect. We've been in contact with some vendors to begin to scope out those parts of the project. Any outdoor work would not happen until spring at the earliest.

What's next:

- Finalize contract and scope with architect.
- Send finalized contract to Church Council for approval of architect and other possible project goals
- Continue to price out different aspects of the project
- Schedule work for the spring and summer as appropriate based on pricing and availability.

The Albion Community Garden provides free food as well as free seeds, plants, and garden space for those who want to grow their own food. This past year they have provided around 3,000 pounds of free food who those in need.

United Methodist Retirement Community Benevolent Fund (Chelsea) helps meet the needs of persons living in the Methodist Retirement Community.

Vision of Life Community Outreach Center. Vision of life action team is dedicated to improving the community at large and focusing on the development of youth. Vision of Life provides opportunities for youth and seniors to mix, relate and learn from one another.

United Methodist Community House's (Grand Rapids) missions is to increase the ability of children, youth, adults and families to succeed in a diverse community.
