Saints

On October 31, we are going to be celebrating All Saints Day. All Saints is a time to recognize the people in our life who had a meaningful impact on us. The people who led us in the faith. The people who loved us no matter what.

The saints I've been thinking of recently are my grandparents Don and Margaret Pier. Don and Margaret raised my mother and her 5 siblings in Beloit Wisconsin, a classic mid-western factory town that hosted a small college. They had grown up nominally Presbyterian, but in the post-war years, the Methodists were planting churches in booming towns and suburbs. So my grandparents were invited to be a part of one such new faith community. Don and Margaret became charter members of Christ Methodist Church in Beloit.

They faithfully attended, had their kids baptized, and most importantly, lived out the faith they were taught in church. Because of that faithfulness, one of their daughters became a United Methodist pastor. Three others remain faithful leaders in their own UM congregations. And three of Don and Margaret's grandkids became United Methodist pastors.

This all happened because two things came together. There was a church that welcomed Don and Margaret into ministry. And Don and Margaret responded faithfully.

What got me thinking, though, is that Christ UMC in Beloit followed the path of many such churches. After the booming years, those midwestern factory towns began to decline. People stopped having as many kids. And

eventually, after 65 years of ministry, Christ UMC closed its doors.

Now we often think about decline and the closing of a church as sad at best and a failure at worst. We try to explain what went "wrong."

But I think that's not the right way to look at it. Christ UMC was not able to continue as a worshipping community in a building much beyond half a century. Yet the legacy of those faithful people lives on. It lives on in my cousins whose parents met at the UM campus ministry in Madison. It lives on in the chaplains trained by my cousin in Milwaukee. It lives on in ministry to people in Nashville, Albion, and Minneapolis. It lives on not in a building or in structures, but in a living, integral faith that was nurtured in a small town and an unassuming house.

So as we celebrate the saints who have gone before, it is good for us to remember what was, the church that used to be. And sometimes there will be grief about how much has changed. But we should also look to what has continued on. To the lives those saints have impacted. To the impact far beyond the time and space of one church. To the ways that God's kingdom is continuing to unfurl because of their faithful witness.

Wesley Renovation Update

How we got here:

Renovating Wesley Chapel and Lounge has been a part of our broader building upgrade plans for a couple of decades. As many know, we have also received two significant bequests that have been designated for use to renovate Wesley.

Why we're here:

Wesley Chapel and Lounge have not had any major updates since they were constructed in the mid-50's. In looking at our church's mission and vision, we decided the space needed to be more accessible, visible, hospitable, and usable. This includes improving the bathrooms, accessibility in Wesley Chapel, and the visibility and accessibility of the archway.

Where we are now:

The team has met with two architects. Our next meeting is Sunday November 7 after church. We will discuss whether we want to move forward with one of the architects we've interviewed. If so, we will send a recommendation to Church Council. Our other work has been in setting priorities. The team's top priorities are accessibility changes to the chancel in Wesley Chapel, upgrading the bathrooms in Wesley Lounge, and visibility and accessibility improvements to the archway and entrance. We have not made any final decisions. Finally, the team discussed financing. At this point, we felt most comfortable keeping our budget to the money we have from bequests. As we get into the design process, we will continue to reevaluate the budget needs of the project.


